Disclaimer: This Tender is an invitation to receive offer from vendors and not an offer by the Technology Development Board (TDB). No contractual obligation whatsoever shall arise from the tender process unless and until a formal contract is signed and executed by duly authorized officers of Technology Development Board (TDB) with the vendor. This tender is for conducting the online examination for a period of three years. While the pattern, modalities and operations remain the same during these three years, there could be minor changes in specific number of candidates, dates of examinations, number of examination papers, number of examination centers, etc.

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1. About Technology Development Board (TDB) and the Scheme

The Technology Development Board (TDB), a statutory body, under the Department of Science and Technology, constituted by the TDB Act 1995 (44 of 1995), to promote development and commercialization of indigenous technology and adaptation of imported technology for wider application and having its office at Technology Bhawan, Block-II, 2nd Floor, New Mehrauli Road, New Delhi-110016.

The TDB is the first organization of its kind within the government framework with the sole objective of commercializing the fruit of indigenous research. The Board plays a pro-active role by encouraging enterprises to take up technology-oriented products, provides equity capital or loans to industrial concerns and financial assistance to research and development institutions. The loan carries a simple interest rate of 5% per annum. With its pro-active stance the Board:

- Facilitates interaction between industry, scientists, technocrats and specialists
- Fosters and innovation culture through contract and cooperative research between industry and institutions
- Provides an interface with financial institutions and commercial banks for leveraging funds
- Facilitates the creation of new generation of entrepreneurs
- Assists partnerships with other, similar technology financing bodies
- Provides vistas for venturing into hi-tech areas
- Creates new job opportunities.

Technology Development Board (TDB) is implementing a scheme of DST namely WISE-IPR.

A large number of women in India are highly qualified in science. Many of them are not able to pursue career in science due to domestic and social reasons. India cannot afford to miss out the skills and talent of such highly educated women. If she aspires to remain competitive in the knowledge society, S&T as a development indicator cannot be identified only with laboratory research. Many lateral and vertical issues need to be addressed for it to become truly a development indicator. The WISE-IPR has been evolved by the Government of India, Department of Science & Technology (DST) for providing opportunities to women scientists who desire to return to mainstream science and work in the area of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR). It aims to train women having qualifications in science/ engineering / medicine or allied areas in the area of IPR and their management for a period of one year. The training will allow them to work from their homes and thus maintain a good balance between professional and domestic demands. About 850 women have already been trained under this scheme, out of which 380 have cleared the Patent Agent Examination conducted by the Patent Office of India. Fifty percent of these women are pursuing their career in the area of IPR. Some of them are self-employed and have become entrepreneurs. Selection of the candidate is being done through an all India examination and followed by interviews. This examination is of about 2 hours duration having MCQ type of questions. These questions involve tables, diagrams, graphs and scientific notations. This is being planned to be conducted in online mode.

2. Purpose and Scope of Work

This tender document is for conducting Online Examination (Computer Based Test) for WISE-IPR, processing for examination on behalf of Technology Development Board (TDB), New Delhi. Yet another purpose is to enter into a contractual relationship with an experienced and qualified Vendor entity which is willing as well would be able to meet the expectations of Technology Development Board (TDB) with respect to conducting examination. The Vendor and Technology Development Board (TDB) will be required to work together to conduct this examination. The Vendor shall provide the technology and the operational solutions for the conduct of online examination for WISE-IPR inclusive of arranging venues, issuance of admit cards, invigilation and infrastructure as required including result preparation. Technology Development Board (TDB) will provide the question papers set for the WISE-IPR examination to be held at the relevant point of time. The total number of candidates taking the Online Examination for WISE-IPR is expected to be around two to five thousand for each year, these numbers are only indicative. This examination may not be held every year; however, the rates and the terms and conditions shall remain the same for a period of three years from the date of execution of the contract.

Scope of work is to provide end to end solution for conducting and processing of examination in online mode as follows but not limiting to the same:

- i. Computer based exam in the predefined cities, this exam is to be conducted at all centres at the same time (together) and will be conducted in one session.
- ii. MCQ type questions with facility of jumbling within the questions and the answers (Question papers would be set up by TDB).
- iii. Questions will contain scientific equations, chemical structures, circuit diagrams or other such characters related to science and engineering, platform provided for online exam should be able to handle it.
- iv. The duration of the examination will be 2 to 3 hours, with provision for additional time, if required.
- v. Medium of examination will be English only.
- vi. There will be negative marking in the examination.
- vii. Train TDB personnel for generating question papers in their required format.
- viii. Providing a help desk for answering exam related queries to the candidates.
- ix. Changing the exam centre of the candidates if the request is received from the candidates in consultation with TDB and ensuring that the change in exam centre is well communicated to the candidates as well as TDB.
- x. Generation of online admit cards and providing information to candidates about admit cards, mock tests, results, etc.
- xi. Tracking how many candidates have downloaded the admit card and inform candidates repeatedly via sms or email to those who have not downloaded.
- xii. Allocation of Exam centres.
- xiii. Creation of Mock Exam.
- xiv. Providing the results (candidates response, raw resources, audit trail & system generated reports).
- xv. Providing support in addressing RTI queries by providing the required data.

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requirement of this exam.

3. Deliverables and Activities to be Performed by Vendor

Successful conduct and processing of online examination for WISE-IPR including designing online examination plan and process in consultation with Technology Development Board (TDB). All activities to be performed have been categorized in three stages i. Pre Examination, ii. Conduct of Online Examination and iii. Post Examination

i) Pre Examination

- a) To provide specifications for hardware and software required at all stages of the WISE-IPR online exams for Technology Development Board (TDB) at online examination centres and for devices and systems to be used for authentication and audit trail mechanisms required.
- b) To prepare and provide documentary manuals for all processes for safe and secure conduct of examination to be followed along with rules for contingency and exception handling/ emergency procedures.
- c) Complete security management processes (physical and technical for all online examination centers, servers, desktops, LAN etc).
- d) To provide training/ manpower for generation of encrypted confidential data that will be used for test delivery across various centres for the conduct of exam.
- e) To provide and setup secured software for authoring and complete examination management process.
- f) To provide a help desk for answering exam related queries to the candidates.
- g) To provide information to candidates about admit cards, mock tests, result, etc..
- h) To track how many candidates have downloaded the admit card and should inform repeatedly via sms or email to those who have not downloaded.
- i) To change the exam centre of the candidates if the request is received from the candidates in consultation with TDB. The agency should ensure that the change in exam centre is well communicated to the candidates and TDB also.

ii) Conduct of Online Examination

- a. Candidate handling at examination centre as per standard process agreed by Technology Development Board (TDB) and Vendor. Biometric data capturing of candidates appearing for the exam.
- b. To ensure adequate air-conditioning at examination centres.
- c. UPS (for each computer system with sufficient backup) and generator facility at the exam centres in case of power failure.
- d. To ensure suitable drinking water and toilet facilities.
- e. To ensure availability of proper security, frisking (of all candidate and staff) at the examination centres.
- f. To provide facility to candidates for mock test – through website and support.
- g. Completion of registration process of the candidates before start of examination (digital photo, bio-metric finger print, signature on attendance sheet, etc) at the examination center.
- h. Deployment of manpower at each centre (50% female staff) like the IT manager, invigilators, support staff, peon, security guards, etc .
- i. There should be one invigilator in each room for every 30 to 40 candidates.
- j. No candidate should be disallowed to give the exam for want of documents. In such

unusual cases biometric capture should be done by capturing candidate's photograph and thumb impression.

- k. The accessibility of the exam centre to be good so that candidates should not face any problems reaching the exam venue.
- l. To maintain complete log of all activities of candidates during the course of examination to enable complete audit ability of the assessment process.
- m. Getting the feedback from candidates after the completion of examination through online feedback form.
- n. Printing of candidate response sheet at the end of the exam as per requirement of the organization.
- o. Display of candidate score at the end of examination.

iii) Post Examination

- a) Preparation of result based on master key provided by Technology Development Board (TDB) in soft copy as well as in printed form in confidential manner.
- b) All data in soft form as collected during the examination process including, bio-metric, attendance sheet, answer logs, raw resource, audit trails etc.

4. Information to Bidders and related Terms and Conditions

In this tender document, Vendor, Bidder, Bidding Agency mean one and the same.

1. Interested bidder may submit the tender on GeM. The name and signature of bidder's authorized person should be recorded on each page of the tender document. All pages of the tender document shall be numbered and submitted as a package along with forwarding letter on agency's letter head. There should be no overwriting or cutting or interpolation. Correction, if any, shall be made by neatly crossing out, initialing, dating and rewriting.
2. All relevant information as specified in the Technical and Financial Bid including the contingency plans should be furnished by the bidders. The bidder is advised to attach any information that is necessary in regard to the capabilities in order to establish that the bidder is capable in all respects to successfully complete the envisaged work. Incomplete information or deliberately suppressing the information may result in the bidder being summarily disqualified.
3. If the bidder deliberately gives incorrect or misleading information in their tender or wrongfully creates circumstances for the acceptance of the tender, Technology Development Board (TDB) reserves the right to reject such a tender at any stage.
4. All explanatory remarks and clarifications, which the bidder may desire to make, must be incorporated in the offer form, failing which the remarks / clarifications shall be ignored and the tender dealt with as it stands.
5. Bidders must keep their offer open for a minimum period of 90 days or as per GeM norms from the date of opening of the tender, within which the bidders cannot withdraw their offer. However, subject to the period being extended further, if required, by mutual agreement from time to time.
6. The technical and financial documents should be submitted separately on GeM. The technical &

financial bid shall be opened as per schedule.

7. Pre-bid conference will be held on September 10, 2026 at Technology Development Board (TDB), Technology Bhavan, New Delhi. Exact time will be intimated through TDB website.
8. At any time before the submission of bids, Technology Development Board (TDB) may amend the tender by issuing an addendum which will be placed on Technology Development Board website only. This will be binding on all the bidders. If amendment is substantial, bidders may be given reasonable time to make amendment or to submit revised bid and the deadline for submission of bids may be extended by Technology Development Board (TDB).
9. Even though agency may satisfy the qualifying criteria, it is liable to disqualification if it has record of poor performance or not able to understand the scope of work, etc.
10. The successful bidder has to sign an agreement evolved by Technology Development Board (TDB) on non-judicial stamp paper which shall include clauses related to liquidated damages on account of delays, errors, cost and time over-run etc and penalties subject to a maximum of 10% of the contract value in any abnormalities. In case the bidder fails to execute the contract, Technology Development Board (TDB) shall have liberty to get it done through any other agency with full cost recoverable from the bidder in addition to damages and penalty.
11. Bidders are neither allowed to join hands to participate in the tender nor allowed to submit multiple bids. In case of detection of such deed, their bid (s) is/are liable to be rejected. Bidding through consortium is not allowed.
12. The bidder should deposit Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand only) along with the Technical Bid through RTGS / NEFT .TDB shall not be liable to pay any interest on the EMD. For RTGS / NEFT, the bank details are as follows:

The bidder must mention the tender reference number in the payment remarks. A scanned copy of the payment proof should be attached with the bid.
13. The EMD is exempted for MSME OEMs who are authorized by the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises. The MSME Certificate has to be produced to claim the same. The MSME Certificate will be verified from the website of MoMSME. In place of Bid security, the agencies/organizations/companies need to submit a Declaration Proforma attached as Annexure II duly signed and sealed along with Technical bid, failing which tender document will not be considered.
14. Earnest money will be returned to unsuccessful bidders within 60 days without interest after award of contract or setting aside the tender, as the case may be. The Applicant should indicate details of their bank account number for crediting the refund of EMD through ECS (RTGS/NEFT). This information should be provided in the Technical Proposal.
15. Earnest money will be forfeited if the bidder unilaterally withdraws the offer within the

period of its validity.

16. In case, the successful bidder declines the offer of contract for whatsoever reasons, his EMD will be forfeited.
17. Upon issue of a Letter of Award (LoA) by TDB, the Successful Bidder shall be required to furnish an unconditional and irrevocable Performance Security Deposit of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only) by way of Fixed Deposit Receipt (FDR) from a commercial bank and hypothecated in favour of Technology Development Board (TDB) and valid for 60 days beyond the expiry of period of contract. In case of extension of contract fresh performance security deposit will have to be deposited.
18. In case of breach of any terms and conditions attached to this contract the Performance Security Deposit of the agency (that has been awarded the contract) will be liable to be forfeited by Technology Development Board (TDB) besides annulment of the contract.
19. The bidding agency shall ensure a single point of contact (technical and administrative) with Technology Development Board (TDB) for a period of three years, from the date of this contract and shall be solely responsible for the execution and delivery of the work.
20. The payment shall be made in Indian Rupees only on or after completion of each stage; in three stages i. Pre Examination, ii. Conduct of Online Examination and iii. Providing Post Examination Deliverables by the Vendor to Technology Development Board (TDB) after successful completion of work without error and delays.

21. The bidding agency should be based in India and operating in India for the last 5 years offering similar services with one office in Delhi NCR. “The agency should have conducted minimum 5 National level CBT exams in minimum 10 states.” They should have a minimum total turn-over of 1 Crore (Rupees One Crore only) in last 3 financial years from CBT (as per GeM).
22. There will be two types of examination centres, namely, Fixed Centres and Floating Centres. A fixed centre will be the one where exam will be held definitely and floating centre is that centre where examination may or may not be held based on the feasibility of conducting the examination in that city. The bidder should have ready infrastructure in the pre-defined cities of India (as given in Annexure-III) in order to conduct exam in a single session.
23. The vendor has to give information of the examination centres atleast 20 days prior to the exam.
24. The bidding agency should own the copyright or should have appropriate license to use the source code being used for conducting the computer based online examinations. The agency should be able to make changes as and when required in any of the components of the software/source code being utilized for the purpose of conducting the said computer based online examinations throughout the term of three years as required and indicated by the conducting institutes in accordance with the requirements and/or changes made by Technology

Development Board (TDB) for the WISE-IPR examination paper or format of the examinations or in any other manner. If source code is taken or licensed from other agency they should have rights- both technical and legal to modify the same.

25. At first place Vendor should ensure that there shall not be any infringement of IPR in the process including preparation, conducting and providing results of the exam. The bidder indemnifies Technology Development Board (TDB) from any liability arising out of any act of infringement of any form of IP.
26. Bidder agrees to confidentiality requirement of process such as information relating to the examination, evaluation, comparison and post qualification of bids and recommendation of contract award shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other person not officially concerned with such process until publication of contract.
27. Agency should be certified for compliance with established Information Security Standards such as ISO 27001, STQC and SoC2. Duly signed copy of ISO 27001, STQC and SoC2 certificates should be submitted along with the Technical Bid. The bidding agency shall ensure that such certificate is valid through the subsistence of the term of three years as stated herein. Any renewal of such certificate shall be the sole responsibility of the bidding agency without any recourse to Technology Development Board (TDB) in any manner whatsoever.
28. The agency should have its own infrastructure for conducting the exam in terms of software platform.
29. The bidding agency should have authorized and globally accepted software certification, preferably CMMi Level 5 in services and Development both. The certificate should also reflect at cmminstitute.com/pars.
30. The bidder should have an in-house quality assurance and product testing team with proven and robust quality management processes required for conducting the computer based online examinations.
31. The bidder must employ multiple backup systems including offline backups to securely maintain the software and its corresponding source code.
32. The bidding agency should also have some of its own exam centres and should inform about the hired ones.
33. The bidder should design a high-performance system and conduct performance tests to verify successful achievement of high concurrency, fast response time, and long-stress duration requirements of the system used to conduct the examinations. Results of such performance tests should be made available to Technology Development Board (TDB) as and when required. Sometimes these tests may have to be conducted within short notice and with strict deadlines. These tests shall be conducted by the bidding agency prior to each of the Technology Development Board (TDB) online examinations each year.
34. The bidder should design a highly secure system and conduct security tests to verify that there are no vulnerabilities that can make the system susceptible to attacks. Comprehensive testing of source code and the infrastructure must be carried out.

35. There should be suitable emergency management plans towards any crisis situations/redundancy of servers, nodes, additional centre locations, and candidate's data. The bidder has to clearly indicate these plans in the technical proposal.
36. The agency should have measures to handle the exam in leak proof manner and there should not be technical glitches. In case these things happen, the agency should be able to handle these situations with a backup plan.
37. The bidder should be able to support the entire solution (across India) on a 24 x 7 basis with a maximum response time of 3 hours.
38. Technology Development Board (TDB) shall award the tender to an agency that fulfil each of the criteria mentioned above and further set out more particularly in the Technical Bid and the Financial Bid.
39. In case of discrepancy between the rate quoted in figure and words, the rates quoted in words will be considered correct.
40. The rates quoted by the Vendor shall not be subject to any variation/review during the contract period.
41. Bidder agreed to provide unconditional support in handling RTI queries at all stages of examination and after the examination as and when requested by Technology Development Board (TDB).
42. All legal proceedings arising out of any dispute between the parties shall be subject to the jurisdiction of courts situated in Delhi (India) only.
43. Technology Development Board (TDB) reserves the right to accept any bid under this tender or to reject any bid or all bids without assigning any reason.
44. Technology Development Board (TDB) reserves right to award the work/cancel the award without assigning any reason. In case of differences, if any, the decision of Secretary, Technology Development Board (TDB) shall be final.

5. Submission of Tender

The Tender Document has to be submitted in proper form along with all relevant documents latest by date **September 24, 2026**.

The bidder shall submit their tender in two parts (i) Technical Bid and (ii) Financial Bid

The tender is a "Two Bid" document. The Technical Bid should contain all the relevant information and desired enclosures in the prescribed format along with Earnest Money Deposit (EMD). The Financial Bid should be sealed separately and must contain only the financial details.

Formats for Covering Letter (Specimen), Declaration/Undertaking, Technical Bid and Financial Bid for this tender document are enclosed as Annexure I, II, III and IV respectively. Technical and financial bidder shall quote rates and fill other details as specified in Annexure III and IV.

6. Evaluation

Technical evaluation (100 points)

- 1) Prior experience of vendor in conducting online Exam: Agency should have conducted exam for minimum of 10 lakh candidates in last 3 years.
- 2) Capability of vendor to develop the requisite software and security & software quality certification: ISO-27001 and CMMi level5 for Development and Service, STQC, SOC2.
- 3) Capability of vendor to conduct online exam (CBT) with 10,000 candidates in single session in multiple states (min 10 states): Agency should have conducted minimum 5 National level CBT exams (Copies of the same to be attached)
